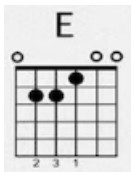
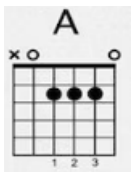


On the (A) Banks of the Roses me (E) love and I sat (A) down
